Old Business:

b. Sealed Bids

- Shed - Five sealed bids were opened by Mayor Tummons. Shed sold to Tyler Remington with his bid of \$2756.00.

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- 4-Wheeler – Two sealed bids were opened by Mayor Tummons. 4-Wheeler sold to Justin Sink with his bid of \$200.00.
- c. KanPay Contract
- Brief discussion about the KanPay point of sale system. This would allow customers to pay for their city fees by debit/credit card, and online bill pay. Discussion tabled, continue at next meeting so Council can review the contract.
- d. Utility Billing
- The Council reviewed and discussed several options regarding changes to the current sewer and water rates. A motion was made in regards to the sewer rates. The water rates will continue to be discussed at the next council meeting.

MOTION: Council Member Zerr moves and Council Member Chupp seconds to increase sewer rates not to exceed 20.8% over current rates with an annual increase not to exceed 3% without council approval. Motion carries 3-1. Council Member Carroll opposed.
